Policy statement for Medical Teaching: Residency Didactics and GME Preceptoring

The Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine, Office of Continuing Medical Education (OSU-CME) reserves the right to determine eligibility of continuing medical education credits based on the American Osteopathic Association (AOA) CME Sponsors Guidelines.

OSU-CME will begin reporting Medical Teaching: Residency Didactic and GME Preceptoring credits on July 1, 2022.

Credit Reporting Periods

- January 1 – June 30 – due to OSU-CME on the first Friday in June annually
- July 1 – December 31 - due to OSU-CME on the first Friday in January annually

Medical Teaching: Residency Didactics

OSU-CME will report Medical Teaching: Residency Didactics for the following OSU Center for Health Sciences (OSU-CHS) and OSU Medical Center (OSU-MC) programs:

Anesthesiology	ONMM3 - (Osteopathic Neuromusculoskeletal Medicine 3)
Cardiovascular Disease	Orthopedic Surgery
Emergency Medicine	Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery
Family Medicine (OMEKO and OSU)	Pediatrics (OMEKO and OSU)
Gastroenterology	Psychiatry
Internal Medicine	Radiology-Diagnostic
Interventional Cardiology	Surgery

What types of providers are eligible for Medical Teaching CME credits?

- Osteopathic, DO Attending Physicians will receive credit on their transcript and credits will be reported to the AOA.
- Allopathic, MD Attending Physicians will receive credit on their transcript.
- *Residents are not eligible to earn CME credits for Medical Teaching.*

What documentation is required?

- Physician information and hours on designated excel template.
 - Full name, credential, AOA # if applicable, NPI #, email address, course name, lecture name, lecture date, lecture time, location, total 1-A hours, and comments.
- Residency didactics schedule on OSU letterhead signed by the Program Coordinator or Director that specifies:
 - Speaker’s full name, credential (D.O. or M.D.), lecture title, date, time, and location (room name or number).
- Copy of the schedule will be compared against the spreadsheet to ensure everything and



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everyone is accounted for. If there are any discrepancies, we will email you for clarification.

GME Preceptoring

OSU-CME will report GME Preceptoring for the following *OSU Center for Health Sciences (OSU-CHS)* and *OSU Medical Center (OSU-MC)* programs:

What types of providers are eligible for GME Preceptoring CME credits?

- Osteopathic, DO Attending Physicians will receive a credit letter and will be reported to the AOA.
- Allopathic, MD Attending Physicians will receive a credit letter.
- *Residents are not eligible to earn CME credits for GME Preceptoring*

What documentation is required?

- Preceptor information and hours on designated excel template.
 - Full name, credential, AOA # if applicable, NPI #, email address, total 1-B hours, and comments.
 - Preceptors are awarded 160 1-B credits per resident per month. (# of residents X # of months)
 - If more than one preceptor has a resident, the hours will need to be split by the reporting department and notated in the comments.
